



# Fighting Anti-Semitism at the University of California



For several years, the University of California has faced some of the most serious charges of anti- Semitism in North American higher education. New developments provide hope that the University will turn this situation around. Kenneth L. Marcus described these developments in a recent article for the Jerusalem Post.
